The Stamp Advisory **Committee** (SAC) considers stamp theme ideas collected from organisations, government departments and the public. The committee includes local citizens, designers and government **representatives**.



Each chosen theme is commissioned to three designers to create a first draft.



Suitable designs chosen by the SAC are sent to special factories for printing.

'Smelly' stamps





▲ Gently **scratch** the stamps and unleash the **fragrance** hidden in the stamps!

Hexagonal stamps



▲ These stamps, called 'Civic Education', are the first **hexagonal** stamps in Hong Kong. The hexagon shape is a symbol of unity and peace.

Sticky stamps



▲ About half of the pictures are printed in black and white, so you can colour in the stamps and envelopes. You can also peel them and stick them like ordinary stickers.
