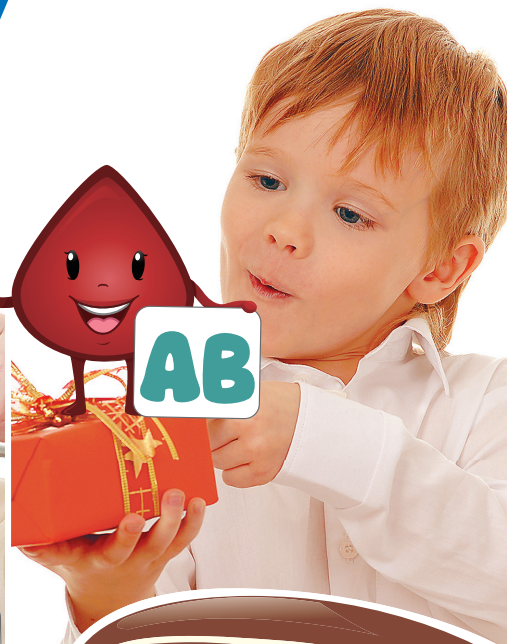

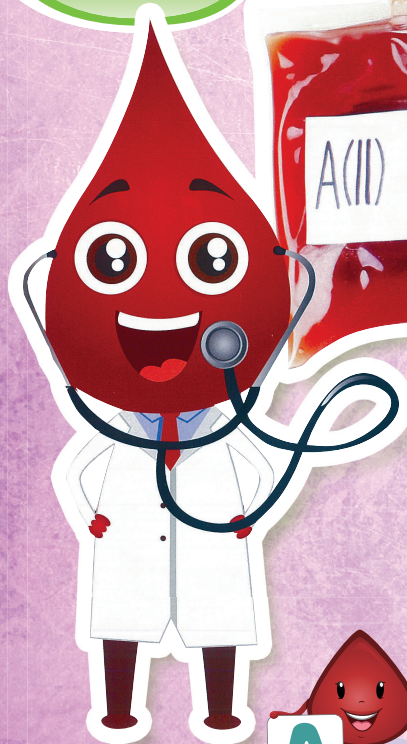

The story of blood types

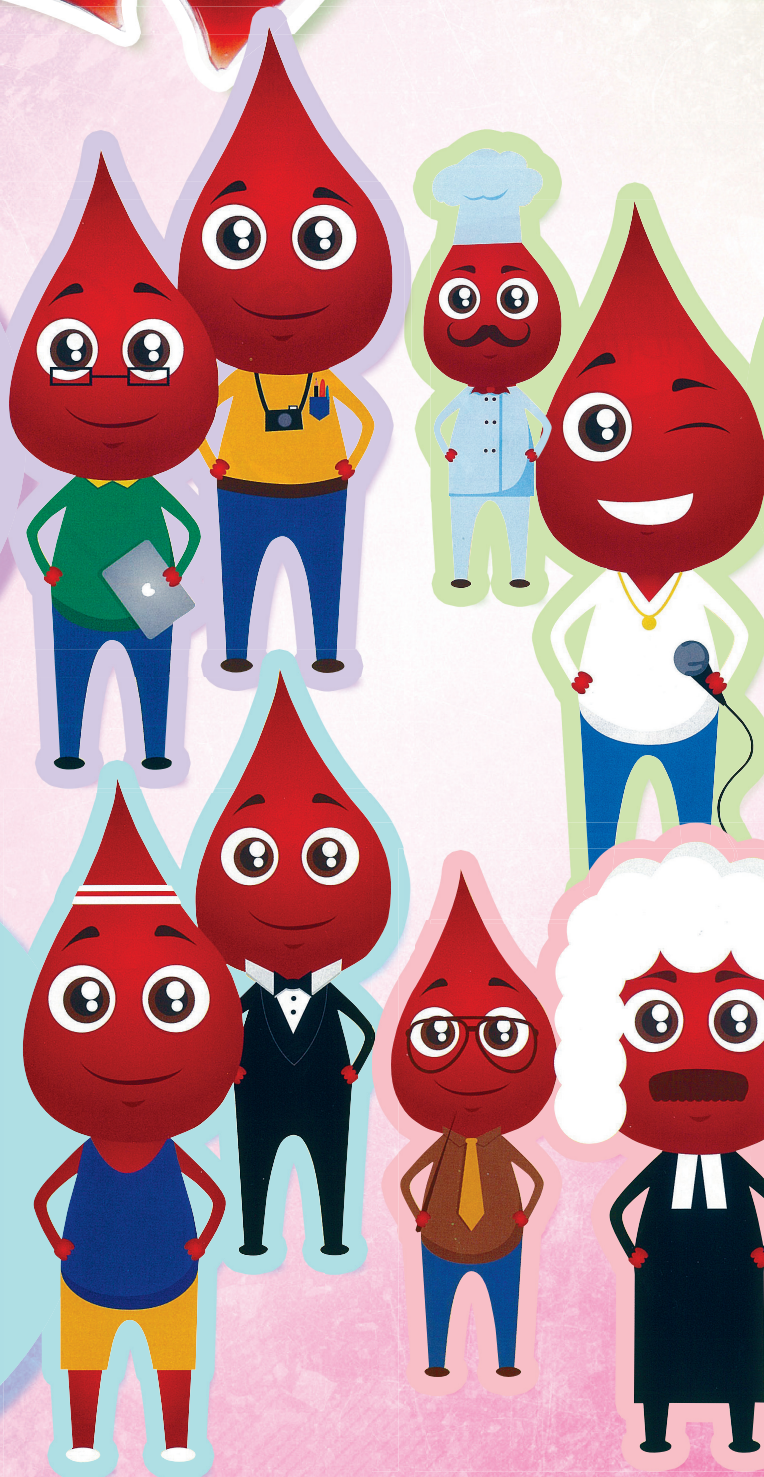
The ABO blood groups were discovered in 1900 by an Austrian (奧地利的) scientist. He wanted to know why some blood **transfusions** caused deaths while others led to healthy recoveries. Later, a Japanese (日本的) researcher developed the **theory** that your personality is determined by your blood type. The theory was soon widely accepted in Japan, and today your blood type may even affect your chances of getting a job there.



People with blood type A tend to be co-operative, sensitive, smart and passionate. Common career choices for such people are accountants, librarians, writers or even computer programmers.



Type Os are mostly responsible, decisive, organised, objective, rule-conscious, and practical. Common career choices are bankers, politicians, gamblers, ministers, investment brokers or pro-athletes. However, they tend to be loners and are more **intuitive**, handling stress better than other blood types.



Blood type Bs are often described as subjective, easy-going, original, creative and flexible. They are **empathetic** and understanding, which makes them good friends. Common career choices for them are cooks, hairdressers, talk show hosts or journalists.



ABs are the most interesting of all the blood types. They can **possess** both A and B traits, often **standing out** from others. They tend to be very charming and popular, which is why their common career choices include teachers, salespersons and lawyers.
