Hoi Ha Wan Marine Park (海下灣海岸公園)

How to get there:

MTR Diamond Hill
Station, Exit C2. Take
bus 92 or 96R (Sunday
and public holidays only)
to Sai Kung town, then
change to green minibus
7 to Hoi Ha Tsuen and
walk to the marine park.









Stairs from the sea

Tung Ping Chau Marine Park (東坪洲海岸公園)

This **rock formation** is called Kang Lau Shek (更樓石). It looks like **stairs**. The shape was formed after the rocks were **eroded** by waves and the weather over many, many years. There are many coral **species** here too.





How to get there:

From MTR University
Station Exit B, take a taxi
to Ma Liu Shui ferry pier
and board a ferry. The
journey takes around
90 minutes. This ferry
service operates only on
Saturdays, Sundays and
public holidays.



The dolphins' home

Sha Chau and Lung Kwu Chau Marine Park (沙洲及龍鼓洲海岸公園)

How to get there:

There is no direct transport. Ask your parents to join the eco tour organised by Hong Kong Dolphinwatch. For details go to this website: goo.gl/Rr3VUp
