# Little birdies

## Crayon chicks



1.



Use an orange crayon to draw a circle on a piece of paper. This will be the body.

2.



Fill in the circle with a yellow crayon. Then, draw an orange beak on one side.

3.



Draw an eye near the beak. Add a wing shape using an orange crayon.

4.




Draw lots of orange lines for a tail at the back of the chick. Add two brown legs.



This chick has **spiky** feathers on its head.

## Chirpy chicks




You could decorate an Easter card with some of these chicks.

1.




Draw a circle with yellow or orange chalk or chalk pastel and fill it in. Then, **smudge** the chalk a little with your **fingertip**.

2.



Use a pencil to draw little lines around the edge of the chick for **fluffy** feathers. Then, draw two small dots for eyes.

3.



Draw a triangle for the beak and fill it in with a red pencil. Draw two legs with three lines for each foot. Then, add wings.

4.



For a chick in a nest, draw lines underneath the chick instead of legs. Then, draw smaller lines that **crisscross** at each side.




You could draw a chick **pecking** at some corn.

5.



For a flying chick, draw two wings at the top of the body and a beak on one side. Draw two legs and an eye.
