EASTER is a **Christian** holiday that started 2,000 years ago, when Jesus died and then came back to life. Christians go to church on this day, but the holiday actually does not always fall on the same date. It is actually always the first Sunday after a full moon following 21 March.

### Origins

THE holiday is a celebration of spring, which has to do with birth and **fertility**. **Hares** and eggs symbolise these two themes. The word 'Easter' comes from the German goddess Eostre. Early Christians adopted this idea because Jesus was reborn, just like living things in spring.

#### Customs

IN the West, children often help **decorate** hardboiled eggs with paints, and then adults will hide them for an Easter egg hunt. Sometimes there is an Easter egg roll instead. Foods eaten on this holiday include chocolate bunnies and eggs, and **peeps**.
