A costly work

RTWORKS by famous artists, living or dead, usually fetch a high price. Here are a few of the most expensive paintings in the world.



THIS was painted around 1955, and was sold at around US\$300 million (HK\$2.3 billion) in 2015. It is an abstract painting, meaning it does not show anything in the real world. It is **privately** owned, but on loan to the Art Institute of Chicago (芝加哥藝術博物館) and displayed there.



Salvator Mundi, Leonardo da Vinci

THIS was painted around 1500 and shows Jesus Christ giving a blessing. Sold at US\$450 million (HK\$3.52 billion) in 2017. the art piece is currently on display at the Louvre Abu Dhabi (阿布達比羅浮宮) in United Arab Emirates (阿拉 伯聯合酋長國).



The Card Players, **Paul Cezanne**

SHOWING people playing cards in Paris, this was painted around 1892-93 and privately sold at US\$250 million (HK\$1.9 billion) in 2011. It is in the Post-Impressionist (後印象派的) style, meaning the painting is about real things and people but they are not shown

realistically. The artwork is owned by the royal family of Qatar (卡塔 爾).



Nafea Faa Iopipo (When Will You Marry?), Paul Gauguin

PAINTED in 1892, this artwork shows two Tahitians (大溪地人) going about their day. This piece was sold at US\$210 million (HK\$1.6 billion) in 2014, also

to Qatar's royal family. The artwork's style is Post-**Impressionist** as well, and Gauguin painted many other art pieces of Tahitians.
