THE best tip for getting good writing skills is to love reading. The more books you read, the better your writing skills will get. You get to learn new words, phrases, sentence structures and even ideas every time you open a book. So read more, and become a better writer.

Write concisely

IF you can use five words to **convey** a message instead of seven, then do it! If you can use three words, then do not use five to make the sentence longer. No one likes to read **clumsy** sentences.

Write a lot

THE simplest way to develop good writing skills is to practise writing. Start writing **habitually** – for instance, keeping a diary will help with your writing because you can then write every day. Just write something, and you will improve eventually.
