**ILLIONS** of years ago, dinosaurs roamed the Earth as the most advanced animals. But they all died out long before humans even appeared.


## The museum hall

THE dinosaur hall at the Smithsonian was closed down in 2014 because the displays were last updated in 1981 and the information on the plaques was inaccurate. In the new hall, you can see a Tyrannosaurus Rex (暴龍), the top **predator** back then, standing over the plant-eating Triceratops (三角恐龍), seemingly about to eat it. The display also shows other animals, mostly other smaller dinosaurs.

## What were dinosaurs?

DINOSAURS were animals from hundreds of millions of years ago. Both birds and reptiles (爬行動物) came from dinosaurs. Some could fly, like the Pterodactyl, though most walked, such as the velociraptor. Some were huge, like the Argentinosaurus. Many, like Sauropods, only ate plants, and others, such as the T-Rex, ate animals. Dinosaurs lived in the Mesozoic Era, which lasted almost 180 million years.
